Home Screen

 Using your internet browser, go to my.mheducation.com.
On the Welcome Screen, enter your Username and Password and click Log In. If you do not have a login, go to mhecalifornia.com to register.

- **2.** The tiles on the Home Screen give you access to the courses you have in your digital "book bag." Click on a course tile, grade level, and course name, to launch the course's dashboard.
- **3.** Use this menu to access:

Files – Upload your own files and access them under MyFiles. **Notifications** – Get notified every time a student turns in an assignment. **Information** – Access the Help menu.

- 4. The Main Menu gives you access to the Dashboard, Calendar, and Settings.
- **5.** You can use the Account drop down to toggle between the **Student and Teacher View** of the class content.

- 2. Use the Main Menu to navigate to your Students, Tests & Quizzes, Reports, Course, and Settings.
