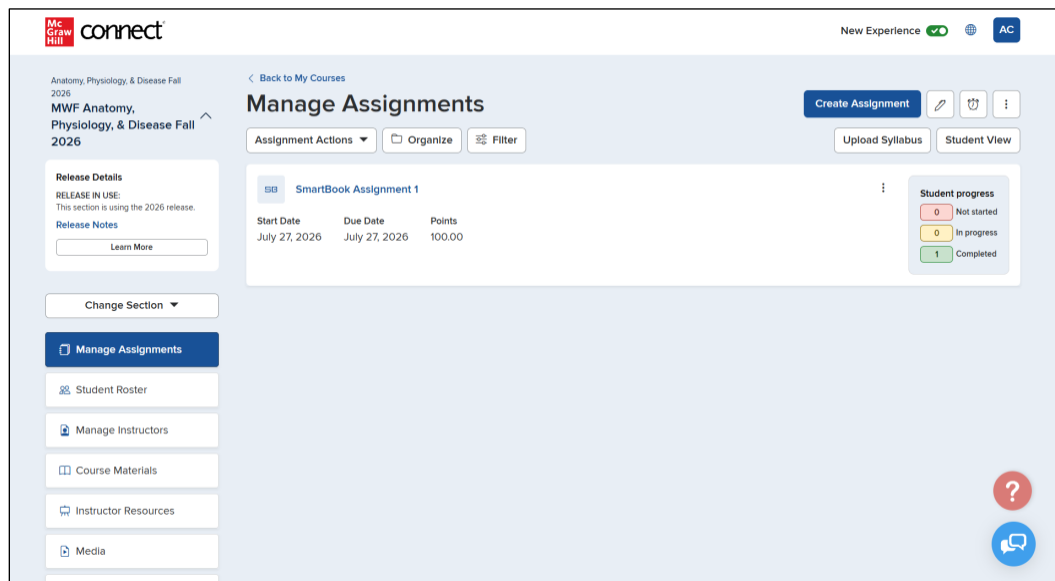


SmartBook Reports In Connect

This walkthrough explains how to access and interpret your SmartBook reporting dashboard. For students, SmartBook personalizes learning to individual needs, continually adapting to pinpoint knowledge gaps and focuses learning on concepts requiring additional study. For instructors, SmartBook tracks student progress and provides insights that guide teaching strategies and advanced instruction for a more dynamic class experience. SmartBook displays reporting data by individual assignment and offers it in a variety of reports.

Step 1: Navigate to Your SmartBook Assignments

Begin in Connect and navigate to **Manage Assignments**. Click on the **SmartBook** assignment.



Step 2: Access the SmartBook Dashboard

Click on the **SB** icon in the top right corner to access the **Reporting Dashboard Information**.

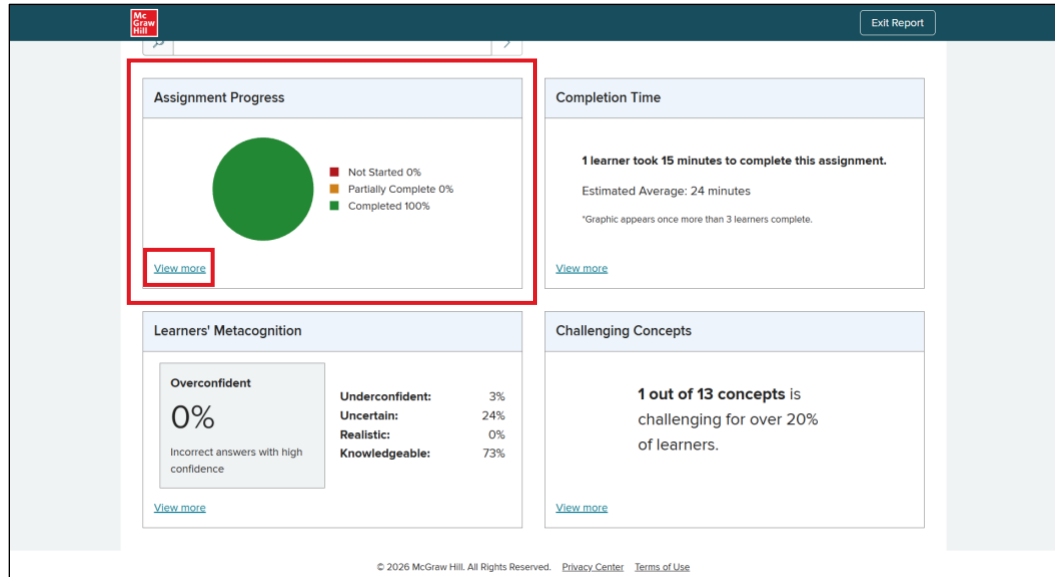

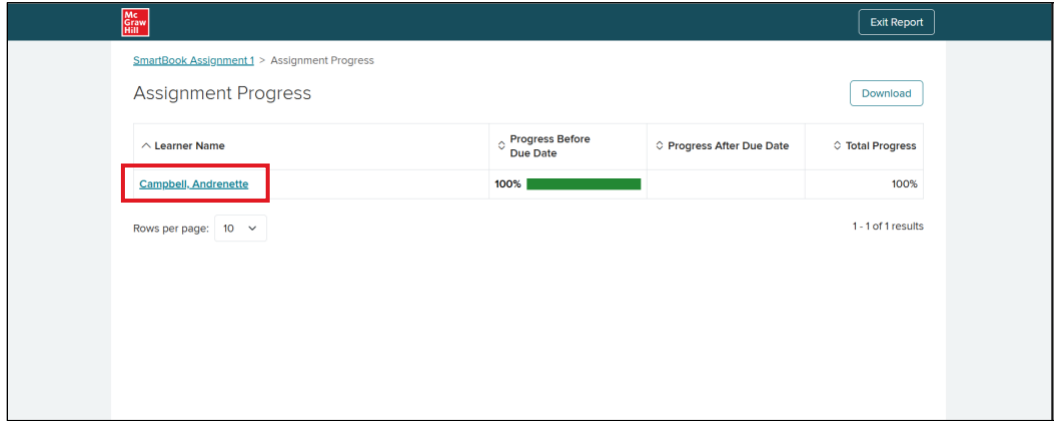
Step 3: Review the Assignment Progress Tile

The SmartBook reporting dashboard is arranged by tiles. In the **Assignment Progress** tile, a pie chart depicts the percentage of students who have not started, are in progress, or have completed the assignment. Click **View More** to see a list of students and their total progress within the assignment.



Step 4: View Individual Student Details

Click an individual student's name to take you to the **Student's Detail page**, which displays individual assignment progress, time spent, and learner metacognition details.

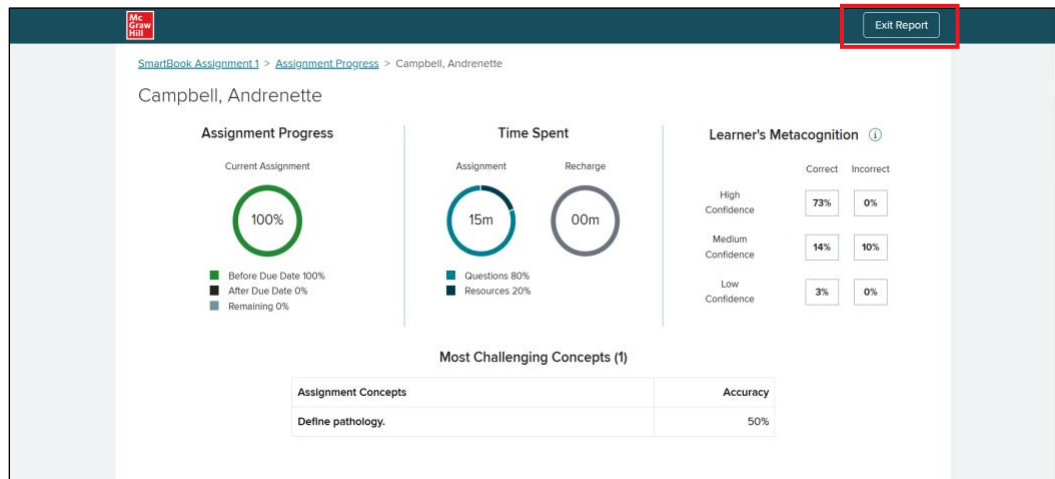

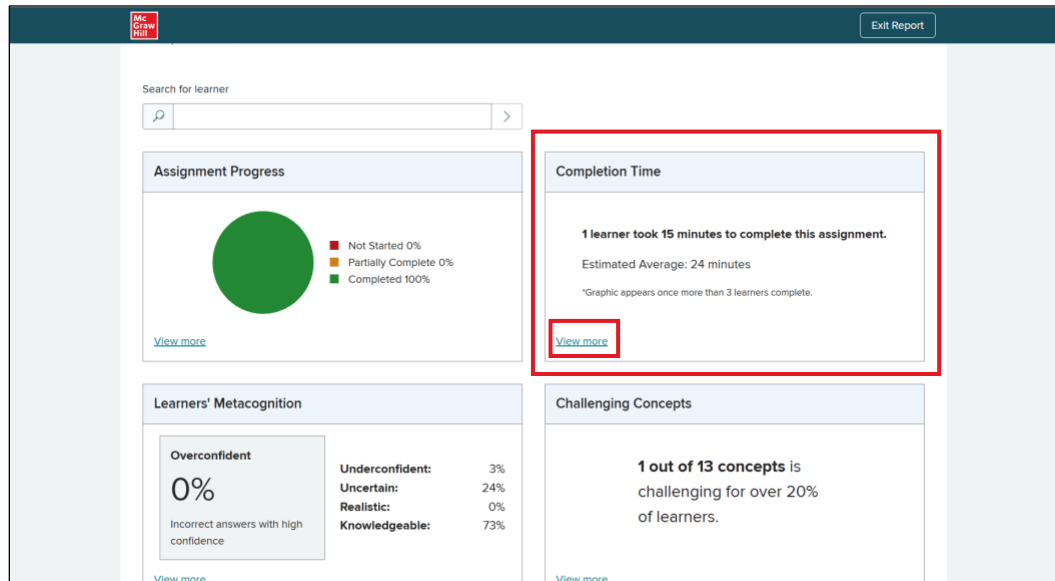

After reviewing the report, click your **SmartBook Assignment name** on the top left-hand corner to return to the **Dashboard Summary**, or click **Exit Report** in the top right-hand corner to close out the report completely.



Step 5: Review the Completion Time Tile

The **Completion Time** tile summarizes the differences between the estimated time of assignment completion time versus how long it actually took the students to complete. By clicking **View More**, you'll see accuracy rates, including work done in both assignment and recharge mode, along with completion time, including time each student spent on questions and percentage of students who opted to review additional concept resources within the assignment.



Again, click on an individual student's name to open the **Student Details Page**.

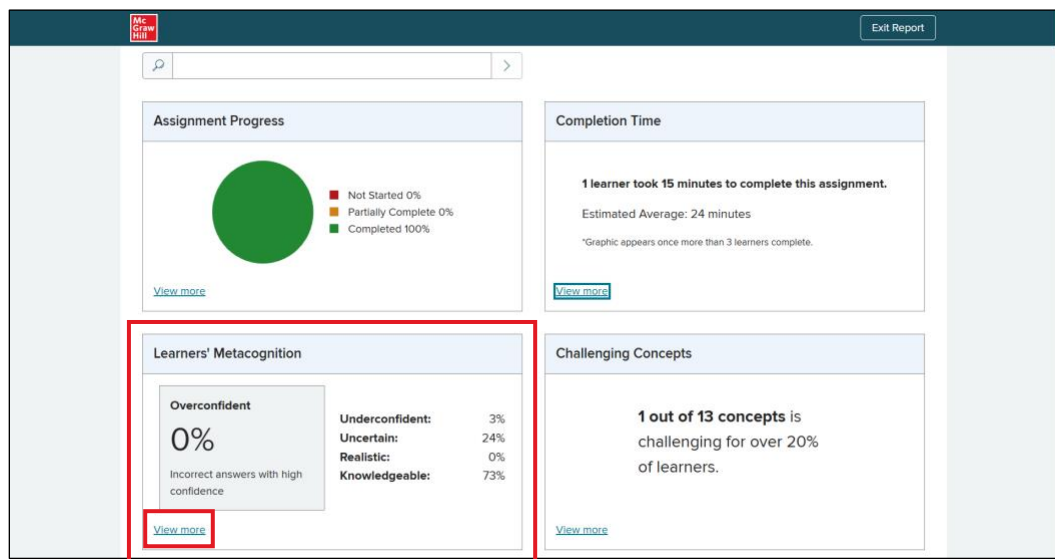

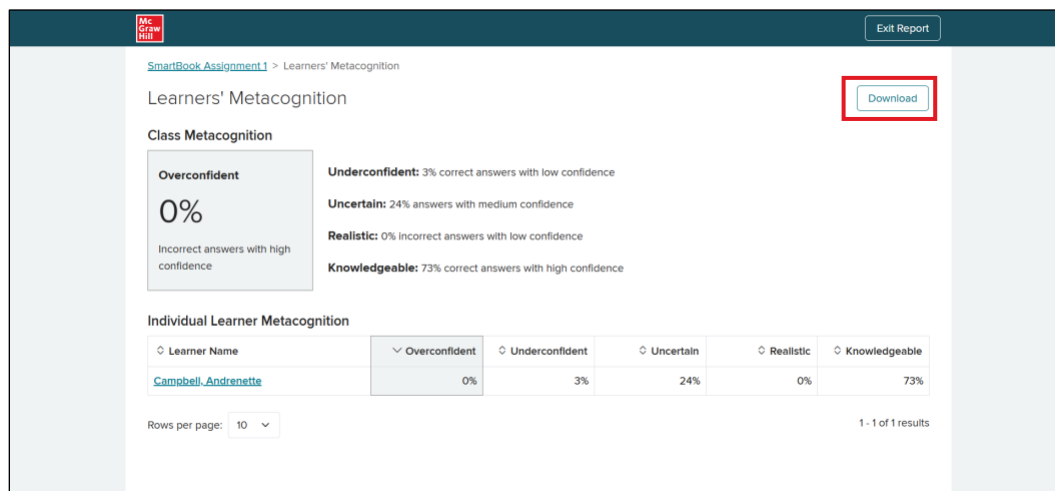

Step 6: Review the Learner's Metacognition Tile

The **Learner's Metacognition** tile shows the metacognition data for the overall course. Click **View More** to see the individual student metacognition data, including whether students answered correctly or incorrectly, along with the level of confidence they chose: High, low or medium.

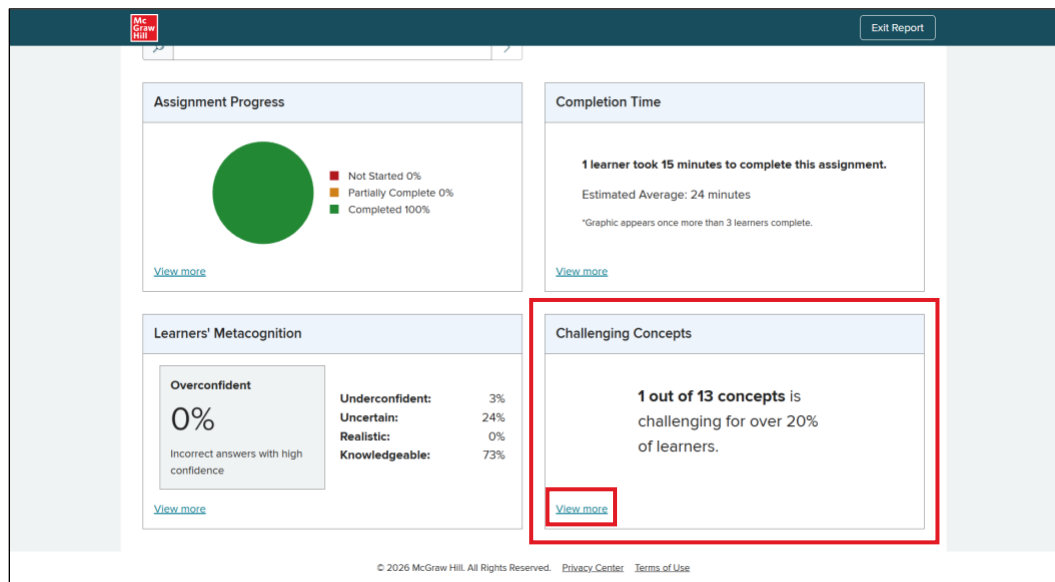


Click **Download** to view this data as a report.

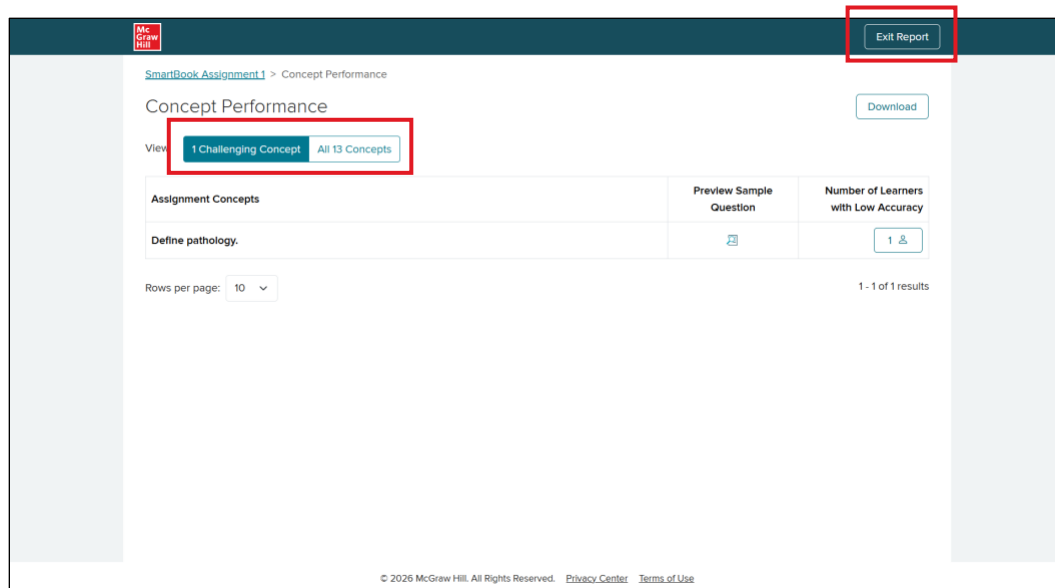


Step 7: Review the Challenge Concepts Tile

The **Challenge Concepts** tile will show you how many concepts were challenging for the students.



Click **View More** to populate the list of challenging concepts. After reviewing the report, click your **SmartBook Assignment name** on the top left-hand corner to take you back to the **Dashboard Summary**, or click **Exit Report** in the top right-hand corner to close the report completely.



The variety of data you'll find on the SmartBook dashboard allows you to quickly identify gaps in student knowledge and easily monitor student learning.
