

Kindness Scenario Cards

Instructions for Teachers:

- Print, cut, and place cards in a deck.
- Use the cards for small-group or whole-class discussions, role plays, or quick bell ringer activities.
- Optional: Ask students to come up with their own scenarios to add to the deck.

Instructions for Students:

For each scenario, answer or act out the following questions:

- 1 | What could you do in the moment?
- 2 | How might your action make the other person feel?
- 3 | What's one barrier that might stop someone from acting kindly here?
- 4 | How could you encourage others to join in?

A new student just moved from another state. You overhear them say they don't know anyone and are nervous about making friends.

Your lab partner keeps making small mistakes and is visibly stressed about their upcoming grade.

A classmate posts something online about feeling overwhelmed and “done with it all.”

You hear some students making fun of a teacher’s accent after class.

Your school custodian is working late after a sporting event in the gym. You notice they are cleaning up a huge mess left in the student section.

At an assembly, a few students are shouting over the speaker and disrupting the presentation.

School Environment

During a fire drill, another student is walking slowly with crutches and struggling to keep up.

Community

Your sports team is playing against a rival school. After the game, you see an opposing player trip and drop their gear right in front of you.

You see a family member is struggling to bring groceries inside.

Community

You notice a younger sibling of your friend is alone at a park looking upset.

A classmate's family just lost their home in a fire.

You see a stray dog wandering near a busy street after school.
