<p>P- Prior knowledge</p> 	<p><i>What do I already know about this topic?</i></p>
<p>P-Patterns</p> 	<p><i>Our brains are "pattern detectors". What patterns do I notice while I am reading?</i></p>
<p>P-Pictures</p> 	<p><i>What information can I gather from the pictures or other text features?</i></p>
<p>P-Prove and confirm</p> 	<p><i>What evidence will I use to prove and confirm my prediction?</i></p>

Prediction: Parent Tip Card

Predicting is an important reading strategy. It allows students to use information from the text, such as titles, headings, pictures and diagrams to anticipate what will happen in the story (Bailey, 2015).

Prediction is a comprehension skill that helps students become more actively involved in the reading process. Promote prediction and building comprehension for your student by encouraging:

- ❖ Asking questions while students read:
 - How does the title help you begin to think about the text?
 - What do you already know about this topic? (**prior** knowledge)
 - What **patterns** do you notice in this text?
 - What information do the **pictures** and text features* provide?
 - What evidence from the text will you use to **prove** and confirm your prediction?
- ❖ Monitoring their thinking and understanding of the text while they read or take notes
- ❖ Encouraging re-reading of the text to better understand facts and details
- ❖ Promoting the retention of information
