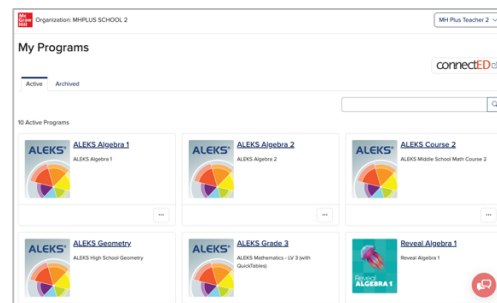
The my.MHeducation.com platform offers a unified landing page for administrators, teachers, and students to launch all their McGraw Hill content and programs, including ALEKS. Here's what to expect when your organization (district or school) begins accessing ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com instead of ALEKS.com.

What's the same?

- ✓ **Access to ALEKS K-12 course library** including grade-level courses aligned to state standards, specialized courses, ALEKS 360 courses, AP Statistics, AP Chemistry, and QuickTables
- ✓ **Equivalent subscription lengths and pricing**
- ✓ **Student learning experience** with Initial Knowledge Check, ALEKS Pie, personalized path, and Progress Knowledge Checks
- ✓ **Real-time reports and Custom Reports** for teachers and administrators
- ✓ **Class and Master Template customization** options, e.g. integrate a textbook; turn topics on/off in the ALEKS Pie or create modules; lock Master Template settings
 - ✓ Existing customized classes and Master Templates can be copied from your ALEKS.com account to your my.MHeducation.com account. Contact ALEKS Customer Support for assistance.
- ✓ **Additional assignments** e.g. Time, Topic, and Progress Goals; Homework, Test, Quiz; Scheduled Knowledge Checks; Worksheets; My Questions
- ✓ **Dedicated ALEKS Customer Support** via phone, email, and chat

What are the benefits?

Service Options

Organizations using my.MHeducation.com choose from two available access services supported by McGraw Hill's Integration Services team: **Single Sign-On (SSO) and Auto-Rostering** or **Direct Login and Manual Rostering**.

Single Sign-On (SSO) and Auto-Rostering

SSO applies to districts that use an SSO portal, district website, or LMS to access McGraw Hill digital programs.

Auto-Rostering means that account creation, class setup, and roster management are automated through a process handled by your district.

Direct Login and Manual Rostering

Direct Login means that teachers, students, and administrators log in at my.mheducation.com. Teachers can self-register if they need an account, then create student accounts. Administrators can create student, teacher, and other administrator accounts.

Manual Rostering means that teachers manually redeem program content (e.g. ALEKS) and roster their own classes.

What's different?

Rostering, provisioning, and class management:

ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com has a bulk upload process available to admins and teachers. ALEKS.com's built-in Batch Registration (for admins) and class Pre-Registration (for teachers) are not available in ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com.



If using **SSO and Auto-Rostering**: ALEKS classes and users are automatically created and updated nightly based on your SIS. Administrators and teachers do not create user accounts nor do they register students.

Organization administrators use McGraw Hill's Access Manager to assign digital content (i.e. specific ALEKS courses) to each user. More information on Access Manager can be found in this [VIDEO](#) or [ARTICLE](#).



If using **Direct Login and Manual Rostering**, administrators and teachers manually create classes and users and assign or redeem content.

Moving students to a different ALEKS course:

Note: When students in ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com are moved into a new ALEKS class, their data does not immediately appear in the new class. It appears after the next time they log into ALEKS.



If using **SSO and Auto-Rostering**: Because students are rostered into a primary class aligned to a particular ALEKS course, teachers must create a sub-class and move the student(s) into the sub-class, all within ALEKS. Teachers can follow the steps in this [ARTICLE](#) to create a sub-class, and this [ARTICLE](#) to move students to the sub-class.



If using **Direct Login and Manual Rostering**: Teachers can follow the instructions in this [ARTICLE](#) (class management guide) to move students to a different primary course.

Logging In:

Users (administrators, teachers, and students) no longer go to ALEKS.com to log in to ALEKS.



If using **SSO and Auto-Rostering** users access their my.MHeducation.com landing page directly via SSO launch point (e.g. LMS, district website) then select the ALEKS tile.



If using **Direct Login and Manual Rostering**, users go to my.MHeducation.com to log in with their credentials, then select the ALEKS tile on the landing page.

Existing ALEKS.com credentials do not work for my.MHeducation.com. Users receive new login credentials.

Shared Access for Co-Teachers:

The class-level Share Class Access setting in ALEKS.com is not available in ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com. To grant co-teachers access to an ALEKS class on my.MHeducation.com, add them to the class roster. Currently there is no access-per-student option; co-teachers see the whole class. There is a limit to how many co-teachers can be on the roster. Our development team is exploring solutions to enhance flexibility of co-teaching options on my.MHeducation.com.



If using **SSO and Auto-Rostering**: Organization administrator can add co-teacher(s) to the class on the OneRoster file. The OneRoster 1.0 and 1.1 instructions explain how to add co-teachers to the roster files.



If using **Direct Login and Manual Rostering**: Teachers can follow the steps on page 10 of the [Class Management guide](#) to add a co-teacher to their ALEKS class.

Reports:

The same district, school, teacher, class, and student-level reports in ALEKS on ALEKS.com are available in ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com, but **existing reports and student progress and activity data do not transfer from your organization's ALEKS.com account into your my.MHeducation.com account**. Save necessary reports and data from ALEKS.com by creating a Custom Report (Excel file) or using individual report downloads. Refer to the **Downloading Reports in ALEKS** guide for details.

Master Templates:

District- and school-level Master Templates are available in ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com. **Beginning July 2024, students can be rostered directly into a my.MHeducation.com ALEKS class linked to a Master Template.** Previously, teachers with classes linked to a Master Template used the ALEKS roster to move students from a default "primary class" (not linked to the Master Template) into a "sub-class" linked to the Master Template. This will be improved for the '24 - '25 school year; the manual teacher workflow will no longer be required for ALEKS on my.MHeducation.com classes linked to Master Templates.
