




Birds, Bugs, and Bats




Birds

All birds have wings. All birds have feathers, too. Birds are the only animals with feathers. Their feathers are light and strong. Wings and feathers let birds fly. Most birds can fly.








Bugs

All bugs have six legs. Many bugs have wings. Some bugs have one pair of wings. Flies have one pair of wings. Other bugs have two pairs. Bees have two pairs of wings. Some insects have big, bright wings. Many kinds of bugs can fly.





Bats

Bats have wings. They can fly. Bats are not birds, however. They are not insects. Bats are mammals, like dogs, cats, and people. Most bats have fur.

Most bats fly at night. They are looking for food. Bats eat bugs or fruit.
