

# Learning and Leading from Legacy

*Civil Rights: A Global Perspective* is an all-digital high school curriculum that examines the non-violent philosophies of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and other influential human rights activists. Organized around the themes of **Freedom, Perseverance, Hope, Justice, and Conscience**, the curriculum offers a variety of primary and secondary sources, digital media, and project-based learning experiences and is suitable on its own or to enrich instruction in courses such as U.S. History, Black Studies, Civics, or Government.

In *Learning and Leading from Legacy*, participants will explore these social justice principles and how, as teachers and mentors to future leaders, they can encourage students to communicate, negotiate, and advocate thoughtfully for important causes. **This session is intended for educators who will be teaching or incorporating *Civil Rights: A Global Perspective* in their class.**



## Learning Outcomes

### Participants Will:

- Explore the social justice principles of Dr. King and other prominent human rights activists as structured in *Civil Rights: A Global Perspective*
- Learn strategies that encourage students to think critically about these principles and apply them to current global issues
- Feel prepared to lead classroom experiences where students engage in civil discourse, discuss complex ideas, and analyze arguments
- Understand how they can develop students' empathy and desire to build an equitable society
