



Today, we all live, work, and play together. We honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., each January on Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Day.





George Washington was also a very important American. He was our first President! We honor George Washington and Abraham Lincoln each February on Presidents' Day.




