Jack was a PT commander in World War II and Joe was a fighter pilot.

In 1938, Jack's father was appointed ambassador to England. Jack traveled in Europe, watching it edge toward World War II. Finally, he discovered he liked studying governments. He wrote a 150-page term paper about European governments and graduated Harvard with honors.

In 1941, after America entered World War II, Joe joined the Naval reserves. Jack's bad back would have disqualified him, but he insisted his father persuade the Navy to accept him.
