

Pronouns: Possessives

Possessive pronouns take the place of possessive nouns.

Rule

Some possessive pronouns are used before a noun: **my, your, his, her, its, our, your,** and **their**.

Some possessive pronouns are used alone: **mine, your, his, hers, its, ours, yours,** and **theirs**.

Example

Dan brought **Dan's** football.
Dan brought **his** football.

That fishing boat belongs to **Beth**. It is **hers**.
