Coral Reef Food Chains

Coral reefs are water communities that have many food chains.

Coral reefs are found in tropical areas where the water is shallow, warm, and salty. Even though coral looks like rock, it is a living thing. It is made by tiny animals called coral polyps.

The producers on coral reefs are plants smaller than a pinhead, called phytoplankton. These phytoplankton are eaten by very small animals such as newly hatched shrimps and crabs. These very small animals are called zooplankton. Zooplankton are the first consumers in a coral reef food chain.
